Vote Bribery In The Disguise Of Free Computer Maintenance Cracked Down

Upon receiving information indicating that a borough chief candidate in Zhonghe City, surnamed Huang, was suspected of vote bribery in the disguise of free computer maintenance since mid-September, 2010, Prosecutor Yen-Hwun, Huang at Banciao District Prosecutors Office (BDPO) conducted initial investigation and with a search warrant, led the police and investigators to search the residence of the suspect in the morning of 11th December. Subsequently, maintenance records were found and seized. The suspect and several computer users were also summoned to BDPO for further interrogation.

With his confession to free computer maintenance as vote bribery, the suspect was released on bail for NTD 20,000.

BDPO calls upon all candidates not to defy the law, and also appeals to the public to support the "Anti-Corruption via Anti-Bribery" policy with any information that may help reveal and eradicate the disgraceful practice of vote bribery, and work together to build a clean and corruption-free future for New Taipei City.
